

- •Be a **Remembrance Book** that preserves their legacy for current and follow-on generations.



Enacted on December 20, 2018, the Chinese American World War II Veteran Congressional Gold Medal Act, Public Law 115-337, gives recognition and honors the veterans with the award of the Congressional Gold Medal, the highest civilian award bestowed by the United States Congress. As stated in the public law, "the commitment and sacrifice demonstrate a highly uncommon and commendable sense of patriotism in the face of discrimination."

Articles throughout the book highlight the involvement and contributions of Chinese American Veterans in World War II.
